



Please complete the attached form to apply for one of the ten soaring scholarships from Youth Flight Canada. Qualified applicants must be licensed Canadian Glider pilots who are 25 or younger with an infectious enthusiasm for soaring. Successful applicants agree to wax their assigned glider or trailer at the beginning of the season as well as complete regular membership duties.

The amount of the scholarship is \$1000. Preference may be given to previous club members.

Successful applicants will receive the value of the scholarship in their member account. The scholarship may be used to pay for flying costs. In recognition of receiving the scholarship, York Soaring Association will reduce your youth membership fee to \$50 (plus HST). Once your scholarship has been exhausted, you are then responsible for the payment of 100% of your flying costs. York Soaring also requires club members to be members of the Soaring Association of Canada. Membership is free for youth 18 and under and \$50 for youth age 19-25. The Soaring Association of Canada offers a limited number of bursaries to youth pilots and recipients of a scholarship from YFC qualify to apply for funding from SAC if they plan to purchase an unlimited flight time package to maximize their time building. Scholarship recipients may also camp overnight at York Soaring free of charge and are entitled to free air time in the ASK-21 owned by YFC for soaring mentoring flights as well as free air time in the 1-34 to build hours and practice soaring skills.

Please complete the application form and submit it via email to Molly Gibson at mollyelizabethg@hotmail.com. You (and your parents if you are <18 years old) must read, accept, and sign that you agree to the terms of conditions outlined in this document in order to apply to the scholarship. Applications are due by May 1, however, if not all funding available is awarded in May subsequent reviews will take place on June 1 and July 1.

Responsibilities of Youth Flight Canada Scholarship Recipients

- Obtain your membership and start flying prior to July 1, 2019 (York Soaring is a busy club with many operations. If you do not join and complete your initial check outs prior to July 1 there may not be sufficient gliders and instructors available to do so)
- Read soaring reference material posted on the York Soaring Forum and be prepared to discuss the concepts with a soaring mentor
- Create and post on the York soaring forum a short introduction about yourself (including a photo) outlining your gliding background, goals for 2019, and expressing your appreciation for the mentoring and financial support of the Youth Flight Canada program and York Soaring.
- Attend a bronze badge training seminar or the cross-country training camp. The dates for these programs will be posted on the website and the forum.
- Use the full amount of the scholarship in the year it is allocated (funds do not transfer through to the following years) and maintain a positive balance on your York account
- Inform the YFC president if the funds will not be used so that they can be reallocated (failure to fully utilize funds without notice will disqualify you from receiving scholarships in future years)
- Assist with hanger unpacking and/or hanger packing each day that you fly
- Participate in regular flight line duties each day that you fly (launching and retrieving gliders, recording flight times, enter flight cards into the computer, etc)
- Wax your assigned glider at the beginning of the season
- Any recipient who stays overnight at York free of charge in the cabins or trailers will clean these accommodations and clean the washroom and showers once a week. They will also cut the grass around these accommodations. These chores are associated with regular member duties for camping at the field.
- Adhere to the youth code of conduct. Youth under 18 years old must confirm in advance that adult supervision is available on the dates they wish to stay overnight.
- Scholarship recipients should focus on flying high performance gliders and improving their soaring skills. Scholarship funding should not be used for flights in 2-33s.

I have read the above terms of acceptance for the 2019 Youth Flight Canada Scholarship and commit to upholding them in exchange for receiving the scholarship.
